SEPTEMBER 10, 2025

This meeting was called to order at 6pm by Chairman Jennifer Priesgen.

Donald Luedtke, Becky Alf, Eric Kohlmann, and Joey Jewell arrived at 6:40pm.

The committee reviewed drafts of various ordinances. The committee agreed to make the proposed updates to Ordinances 376 – 381 and make a recommendation to the Board to approve.

The committee also reviewed the fee schedule. The community room rental will be \$25/use plus a clean-up fee of \$50 if needed to civic organizations, employees, and Board members. Sterr Park will be free for these organizations, but the clean-up fee will apply if needed. The committee will make a recommendation to the Board to approve the updated fee schedule.

The sex offender residency restriction ordinance was reviewed. The Village attorney advises that the residency restriction be set at 350' from any park, school, church, etc. The attorney believes this restriction will be upheld in court if contested by an offender. The committee agreed to keep the current ordinance in place as it stands at 1,500'.

Motion by Gary More, seconded by Jessica Loomans to adjourn the committee meeting at 6:59pm. Motion carried.
