

Sec. 22-4. - Parking regulations.

(a) *Streets; no parking.*

- (1) There shall be no parking upon any village street or portion thereof where the village has placed "no parking" signs. The village board reserves the right to determine the designation of no parking locations by amendment to this section at any time. With such designations being adopted by reference hereto as if fully set forth herein.
- (2) Milwaukee Street. There shall be no parking on Milwaukee Street (Highway 175) within the village between North Avenue and Maple Street. Parking is prohibited on the west side and east side of the street. "No parking" signs are placed in this location.

(b) *Seasonal restrictions.* There shall be no parking on any village street on any day between 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from November 15 to March 15. This subsection shall not apply to emergency vehicles on active duty.

(c) *Restricted parking areas.*

- (1) *Two-hour parking.* Parking is prohibited for more than two hours in those areas or on those streets or portions thereof so designated by village signs and markings.
- (2) *Three-hour parking.* Parking is prohibited for more than three hours in those areas or on those streets or portions thereof so designated by village signs or markings providing for same.
- (3) *Fifteen-minute parking.* Parking is prohibited for more than 15 minutes on South Avenue from 4th Street to 3rd Street, Monday through Friday between the hours of 3:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m.

The village board reserves the right to determine the designations under this subsection (c) by amendments at any time, with such designations being adopted by reference hereto as if fully set forth herein.

(d) *Physically disabled parking.* Parking, stopping, or standing prohibited in parking spaces reserved for vehicles displaying special registration plates or special identification cards. Except for a motor vehicle used by a physically disabled person as defined under Wis. Stats. § 346.503(1), no person may park, stop or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended and whether temporarily or otherwise, upon any portion of a street, highway or parking facility reserved, by official traffic signs indication the restriction for vehicles displaying special registration plates or a special identification card issued under Wis. Stats. § 343.51.

(e) *Other restrictions on parking and stopping.*

- (1) No person shall stop or leave any vehicle standing in any of the following places except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading in receiving or discharging passengers and while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator so that it may promptly be removed in case of an emergency or to avoid obstruction of traffic:

- a. In an alley;
  - b. Within ten feet of a fire hydrant, unless a greater distance is indicated by an official traffic sign;
  - c. Within four feet of the entrance to an alley or a private road or driveway.
- (2) Owners or lessees of public or private property may permit parking by certain persons and limit, restrict or prohibit parking as to other persons if the owner or lessee posts a sign on the property indicating for whom parking is permitted, limited, restricted or prohibited. No person may leave or park any motor vehicle on public or private property contrary to a sign posted thereon.
  - (3) When parking on the streets and in parking lots where parking spaces are indicated on the pavement, vehicles shall park within the indicated spaces.
  - (4) Trailers are prohibited from being parked on any village street for more than a 24-hour period. Subsection (b) of this section will override this article.
- (f) *Parking prohibited.* No person shall park a bus, recreational vehicle, trailers of any size or type, or truck which is more than 30 feet in length on any local street, alley or state highway in the village at any time.
- (1) The term "recreational vehicle" is defined as any motor vehicle designed or modified for use on unimproved terrain if used for recreation or pleasure off a public way. Examples include ATVs, UTVs, boats, snowmobiles, motorhomes or any other vehicle that receives approval by the police department.
  - (2) Residents are limited to park one bus, recreational vehicle, trailers or any size or type, or truck less than 30 feet in length in the driveway of the property.
  - (3) Vehicles and trailers being stored in a residential district may be parked on the road, per subsection (e)(4) of this section or may be parked on the owner's property and must be in the driveway. Recreational vehicles and trailers parked on the driveway must not be more than 30 feet in length and must be clear of, and set back behind, the sidewalk. Entire widths of the sidewalk must be passable.
  - (4) Parked vehicles and trailers must be licensed, registered and insured as required by state law.
  - (5) Parked items must be in usable/functional condition.
  - (6) Parked items cannot be used as a dwelling for more than 24 hours.
  - (7) Special parking consideration will be given on a case-by-case basis by the police department.
  - (8) The police department has the authority to direct an owner to move his parked item to a different location, on or off the roadway, if it is deemed to be a safety hazard by the officer on duty.
